Report to the Board

UUSJ Issue Survey

Revised 9/26/2015

An issue survey was sent to all UUSJ Board members and all individual members requesting responses to determine which issues UUSJ should focus on in the coming year. A second invitation was sent in August to new members. The survey form was online from June through August 2015. Attached are detail elements of the survey.

General Findings:

- 1. The survey was initially sent to 64 people and subsequently sent to about a dozen people. 19 people participated from June 1 through August 8. Additionally, 7 people participated in the trial of the survey. Further, 3 who were new members participated. So a total of 29 people responded out of 76 or about 37%.
- 2. There were four issue topics that had greater interest than the others: Escalating Inequality (84), Climate Change (76), Campaign Finance Reform (48), Racial/Ethnic Equality (47). These issues should be strongly considered for UUSJ focus areas.
- 3. Respondents were most interested in participating 2-3 times per year (73) or monthly on issues (50). Current UUSJ programming meets this frequency.
