Guidelines

Apply your mission to your moral owners in the direction of your vision, based on your values. Ends focus on your uniqueness.

- Ends focus on the beneficiaries of your work (moral owners), not your organization
- Ends intentionally exclude what you do as well as how you do it
- Ends refer to the external world, never your organization
- Ends must align with your vision and be consistent with your values
- Goals are the measurable tool, ends are not. Goals implement ends.

UUSJ exists so that...

- national policies that reflect UU values will be vigorously supported through engagement, education, and advocacy (moral owners: UUs, UU congregations)
- frontline communities will have a trustworthy and responsive faith partner to advocate with them for federal policies that address equitable national social justice issues (moral owners: frontline communities and those who represent them)
- Congressional staff will recognize that UUs have an effective, respectful moral voice on social justice issues (moral owners: UUs and UU congregations, frontline communities and those who represent them)
- UUs and UU congregations will have an authoritative and effective means to advocate for UU values at the federal level that contribute towards a just, compassionate and sustainable world community (moral owners: UUs and UU organizations)
