

During June and July, members of the Immigration Action Team and others met virtually with 17 Senate offices to advocate for pathways to citizenship for undocumented immigrants who are recipients of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) and Temporary Protected Status (TPS), farm workers, and essential workers.

Pathways to citizenship was also the subject to our July/August Action Alert calling on the House and Senate to use the reconciliation process to pass a budget that includes such pathways.

In August, the IAT sent a letter to Vice President Harris and Secretary of Homeland Security Mayorkas urging the Biden Administration to stop using the public health authority of Title 42 as a pretext to expel families, adults, and children seeking refuge at the southern border.

The IAT has sent letters to the offices of ten moderate Democratic Representatives seeking to meet with them to advocate for pathways to citizenship for undocumented immigrants who are recipients of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) and Temporary Protected Status (TPS), farm workers, and essential workers.

The IAT has also updated that July/August Action Alert on plans to send emails to UU congregations in the districts of the ten moderate Democratic Representatives asking them to notify their members of our revised Action Alert so that they can use it to contact their Representative regarding pathways to citizenship.
